


Afri: Cultivating Emotional Intelligence for a More Peaceful World (https://www.activelink.ie/node/112086)

- Practical Strategies: Participate in hands-on activities that offer practical strategies for integrating emotional intelligence for social justice into your teaching practices. From developing empathy in students to managing classroom dynamics, you'll discover tools that can positively impact your approach to education.
- Creating Peaceful Classrooms: Explore ways to cultivate a more harmonious classroom atmosphere. Learn how to recognise and address emotions, promote mindfulness among students, and encourage open dialogue.
- Building a Just World: Understand the role of educators in shaping a just society. By fostering emotional intelligence, teachers can empower students to become compassionate global citizens capable of contributing to positive change <u>in solidarity</u> (https://www.worldwiseschools.ie/global-citizenship-education/acting-in-solidarity/).
- Interactive Discussions: Engage in meaningful conversations with fellow educators, sharing experiences and insights
 to enrich your teaching practice and contribute to a supportive community of teachers applying a Global Citizenship
 lens.
