The most recent Programme for Government failed to deliver it's promise of a new, updated, National Carers Strategy. The current Strategy is out of date, with no assigned Budget, and is no longer fit for purpose in any way.

With a General Election taking place on November 29th, a new Government will be in place in the coming months which is in a position to make real radical change to family carer policy in Ireland.

The diversity of care and caring in Ireland must be at the heart of any new Strategy. Whilst there are many actions which should be retained and reinforced in a new Strategy, the time has come to acknowledge the challenges that this brings.
