Our Community Rehabilitation Assistants are highly trained specialists and a crucial part of our team. They work with brain injury survivors on a day-to-day basis, providing the guidance and support they need to achieve their own goals. They are expert communicators with hands-on experience of the impacts of brain injury for the person and their families.

- Form a rapport with persons served and maintain a positive constructive, and professional relationship
- Undertake the role of Keyworker as required
- Provide support to achieve the goals set out in Individual Rehabilitation Plans (IRPs)
- Improve quality of life by developing, encouraging, and supporting the activities of daily living, including personal care
- · Encourage family, personal and neighbourhood relationships and interactions
- Develop strategies to maximise the ability of the person, build coping mechanisms for daily living and promote independence
- Working with persons served to ensure they need as little support as possible in the future
